I believe I may have just uncovered a well of information, from Eric's book, that will provide information for my additional newsletter messages in 2023. Thanks Eric, in more ways than one.


Finally who knew that an idea that sprung forth on Christmas Eve-2006 would continue to be tried every year unless weather or COVID 19 was a show stopper!

# In the Neighborhood AIA PARK COMMITTEE NEWS

Thanks to the folks who helped clean up the Halls Springs area of the park on Oct. 15. A total of 22 bags of trash were removed! We are going back to this area to work on a patch of woods between the Halls Spring and Harford Rd. that is overrun with invasive vines on **Saturday**, **Nov. 12th**, **10:00-12:00**. Your help is needed to remove these invasives and help prevent their spread! No experience needed as there will be instructions on vine identification and removal techniques as well as gloves and tools.

We will be partnering with TreeBaltimore to host our annual tree giveaway this spring, so it's not too early to start thinking about yard and/or street trees you might like to plant! The order should come out sometime in December. Louie Carlat is once again organizer for this and will send out a list of what native trees will be available and some resources for choosing a good tree for the spot you have in mind.

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy this beautiful fall weather! Just a reminder to properly dispose of yard waste. Leaves are a great source of mulch for lawns and flower beds. Just run over them with the lawnmower to help them break down and enrich the soil. They also provide winter habitat for insects which are an important food source for birds. **DO NOT DUMP** leaves or yard waste in the park! This is how non-native species are spread through seeds, stems and root cuttings. Please email me below with any questions or thoughts and thanks for taking care of our park!

# Baltimore City DPW Press Release

Autumn has arrived and so have the falling leaves in Baltimore City. Leaf collection season has begun and will continue through Monday, January 2, 2023 During these dates residents can call 311 for special Monday pickups of up to 20 bags of leaves. Residents can make multiple appointments until all the bags are gone. Residents must call before 6 p.m. on Sunday to schedule a collection for the following Monday. The Bureau of Solid Waste will also collect bagged leaves on regularly scheduled trash collection days up to 5 bags from each address every week with trash collection.

Residents should NOT let leaves collect on the curbs and gutters and please do not sweep or blow leaves into the street. **Please do** rake and bag leaves from your curbs, sidewalks, alleys and off of storm drain grates.

Additional options for dealing with leaves include composting and mulching. These options promote healthy lawns and gardens.
