

Tuesday = recycling

We have single stream recycling in the city. This means that clean paper. cans, glass and plastics can be recycled together.

NO plastic bags



Thursday = trash

Cans with lids for trash. Plastic bags only for yard debris. If you have branches or shrubs to dispose of, they must be bundled and tied in 3 ft. lengths and put out with your trash.

Bulk Trash pick-up

2nd Friday of each month (up to 3 large items) Friday, May 12 Friday, June 9 Friday, July 14 * remember to call 311 at

least 3 working days in advance to schedule your pick-up

311 "It works"

Report broken curbs potholes, city trees in need of removal, or cars that appear to be abandoned to 311.

Give them the location and/or tag #. Get the tracking number so you can follow up if it hasn't been taken care of.


