President's Message

The season is starting to change again. Kids are heading back to school and the evenings are getting cooler. Speaking of school the AIA Board recently voted to increase the amount awarded for our annual Preziosi Scholarship, named for a Baltimore City art teacher who lived in our neighborhood, and whose wife and family remain active Arcadians. The award was increased from \$200 to \$500 by the board for this and future years. After a review of submitted essays the award was split between Carla Brill-Carlat who is heading off to Smith College and Jaelyn Westbrook who will be attending UB. The Board realizes that while the monetary award is not great relative to today's college costs, the benefit of a close-knit community recognizing and rewarding youth achievement is priceless.

As president of the association for the last year it had been my goal to widen the pool of engaged community membership while increasing inclusiveness and diversity. While we have been fortunate in recruiting some new board members there is still so much that can be done. Thanks to ideas put forth by our VP, Kim Burns, we are moving forward with plans to revitalize our association committees. This will open up numerous opportunities for increased community participation within the AIA structure. Anyone interested in an officer or board position can get involved now, introduce themselves to current members, and then step up to an elected position in March. These committees are outlined on page 3 in the newsletter. We recently created a "welcome committee" to create a formal mechanism to welcome new neighbors but most of the committees need to be re-formed from scratch. Of particular interest given the recent vandalism and potential opportunities in Heinz Park is the Parks Committee.

PLEASE mark your calendars and plan on attending the all-community biannual meeting on Thursday, September 14 at Ray of Hope Baptist Church.

Planned presentations include a police NE District update, a neighborhood history presentation, and an update on new development at "SoHa Row" which includes the relocation of Zeke's Coffee Café. Article 8: Committees--Arcadia By-laws

The President shall appoint, at the annual meeting or as soon as possible thereafter, five (5) standing committees of not less than three (3) members each. Said committees shall serve during the interim between annual meetings. The standing committees shall be designated as follows:

- Parks: Attending to matters of parties, crime, clean-up, mowing, and other park issues as determined.
- 2. Community Development: Attending to matters of zoning, housing, commercial buildings, violations, infrastructure, and other community development issues as determined.
- **3. Events:** Attending to matters of the yard sale, picnic(s), contests, block party (parties), and other events issues as determined.
- **4. Communications:** Attending to matters of the newsletter, Internet web site, publicity and advertising, membership directory, and other communication issues as determined.
- 5. Public Relations: Attending to matters of the NE Police (liaison, crime statistics, Citizens on Patrol) and fire departments, interacting with surrounding neighborhood associations, neighborhood umbrella organizations and governmental agencies and offices, and other community relations issues as determined.
