A cool and rainy end to February makes it seem as if spring is right around the corner. Bulbs are sprouting up and I saw what I believe were a large patch of wild snowdrops (galanthus) already beginning to flower in the woods in Herring Run Park. The change in seasons is a reminder of the passing of time. And it is time once again to elect officers and board members to the Arcadia Improvement Association. Unfortunately, despite my previous call for new participants to take up what could be vacant officer and board positions we did not receive much input. Nevertheless the nominations committee has prepared a slate that can be quickly approved by vote at our upcoming meeting on March 8. If anyone has any last minute nominations please do not hesitate to contact me or one of the other current officers. It is not a closed process.

There have been efforts made by our Councilman Ryan Dorsey to create a larger sense of community by hosting what has been termed an Assembly of Neighborhoods. I have been attending these meetings and pleased by the turnout. There seems to be willingness by other neighborhoods that comprise the 3rd District (as well as being part of the police designated Northeast District) to address larger issues of crime and infrastructure as a group as well as to share information and ideas. A key issue continues to be the slowing of vehicular traffic and the development of the Harford Rd corridor as a friendlier pedestrian and cycle oriented dining and shopping area. I hope this group continues to work towards pulling together to get more recognition and resources to the district as a whole.

I am proud of the turnout we have had at our last few AIA meetings which I believe, despite our smaller size, is one of the larger neighborhood meetings in the Northeast. However, the AIA leadership group would love to increase the participation level by all members on a more continuous basis.

***Some of our officers and board members have been serving many years volunteering time and energy to help make our neighborhood a "hidden gem." While they have worked and sacrificed time willingly there is also realization that we need new and diverse members to step up to continue building on the groundwork that has been laid.

As I have mentioned previously in order to facilitate this we are re-activating our somewhat dormant committee organization to give neighborhood residents a chance to pitch in and get involved at a level that may be more comfortable and focused on specific interests. The committees are: parks, community development, events, public relations, and communications. More information is contained on the inserted flyer. For the sake of getting the program off the ground various board members and officers have agreed to temporarily chair these committees. The key word is 'temporarily'. We are hoping neighbors with specific interests, connections, and skills will volunteer to head various committees and perhaps move on to take more active roles as officers and board members in the future.

At our meeting we have a commitment from Major Shorter to give us an update on crime prevention and recent successes in the district but then we will move on to a quick election process. After that we will have some open time for people to discuss the potential work and focus of various committees and a sign up opportunity. This is your opportunity to have some real input into the direction of our great neighborhood. Please come to the meeting, meet new neighbors, ask questions, and get involved.




